

Improvements Continue in Terminal A Renovation

Renovation Project Moving Forward


Work continues in all areas of San Antonio International Airport with the Terminal A renovation. To date, 14 of terminal 17 airline gates have been completed. The project which also includes renovations to the baggage claim area, ticket lobby and concourse is scheduled for completion in May 2014. When complete, some of the terminal improvements include the renovation of 12 public restrooms, installation of new flooring and finishes, upgraded interior lighting, six new escalators and the refurbishment of five elevators. Work on the terminal's HVAC and fire sprinkler system is also planned.

Terminal A's lobby has received a major facelift with the replacement of all airline ticket counters and wall furnishings and new signage installation will follow. Contractors continue to make great strides on the terrazzo floors in the area with the TSA checkpoint complete and moved back to its original location. The checkpoint was temporarily relocated for six weeks to allow work to begin in the area. As an improvement, the TSA queuing line was expanded and reconfigured into an adjoining space.

Work has already started on the food courts. The spaces will be renovated with improvements made to the ceiling, lighting, floors and walls and will receive all new furniture. Retail store fronts are also scheduled to receive an all new look during the project. Work in the baggage claim continues and is drawing near completion while rental car locations are set to receive new signage. To date, one set of the facility's six entry doors has been replaced and four of the six sets for public restrooms have been completed. With the renovation and the increased number of travelers during the holiday season, passengers are urged to arrive two hours before flights scheduled before 7:30 a.m. and 90 minutes for flights thereafter. The program, managed by industry leader HMS Host International also included the opening of La Gloria, La Tapenade, Mission City Ice House, Auntie Anne's and Cinnabon. Other Terminal A concessions include Rasing Canes, Blimpie's and Dunkin' Donuts. The Terminal A concessions offer passengers a diverse mix of national brands and local favorites similar to those offered in Terminal B.
