**Applications being accepted for positions on the River Walk
Capital Improvement Advisory Board**

SAN ANTONIO (July 6, 2016) – The City of San Antonio is currently seeking applicants to serve on the River Walk Capital Improvement Advisory Board. Positions will remain open until filled.

The River Walk Capital Improvements Advisory Committee is comprised of seven (7) members from the following categories: two (2) River Bend Lessees; one (1) downtown resident who is NOT a lessee; one (1) downtown business owner who is NOT a lessee; one (1) City of San Antonio Director of Downtown Operations; one (1) City of San Antonio Historic Preservation Officer; and the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department. The Committee advises the City Council on spending priorities from the River Walk Special Revenue Fund dedicated to capital infrastructure improvements of the River Walk. Meeting times and locations vary.
