Customer Service issues handled by calling 311 include, but are not limited to:

- **Broken traffic signals**
- **Brush & bulky item collection:**
 - Check your front door for a yellow door hanger stating that it is your turn for the collection.
 - Place your brush and bulky items at the curb. Materials must be out by 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of your collection week. *Separate brush from other materials.*
 - Crews will pass by your house once. Materials placed out after crews have passed are subject to fines up to \$2,000 a day.
- **Dead animal pick up**
- **Garbage collection:**
 - The 96 gallon brown cart is for bagged garbage.
 - The 96 gallon blue cart is for loose recyclables.
 - 48 gallon cans are also available upon request.
 - Automated customers can request an additional collection twice per year by calling **311**.
 - Walk-up service is also available for those with medical conditions or disabilities. Call **311**.

Contact Code Compliance if you see an issue with:

- **Dangerous structures** - dilapidated or rundown homes.
- **Minimum housing standards** - the interior and exterior of homes or commercial buildings must be in good repair, free of rodent infestation, sewer leaks, and the accrual of garbage.
- **High weeds and vacant lots** - grass higher than 12 inches.
- **Obstructions on city property or rights-of-way** - such as sidewalks & streets.
- **Outside storage** - Yards should not be used to store tires, cars, building materials, indoor furniture, appliances, etc.
- **Garage sales** - a permit must be purchased for all residential garage or yard sales. Residents are allowed three garage sales each calendar year and only one sale every three months. Permits may be purchased at one of the four community link service centers. **The District 10 Community Link Center** is located at 11220 Perrin Beitel, Suite 112, 78217; 207-5165.

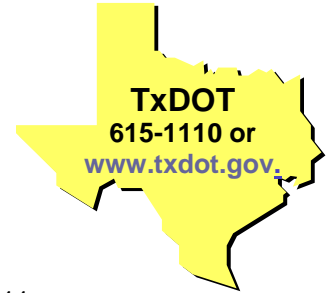

STREET SIGNS & PARKING

It is illegal to park:

- In an intersection or loading zone
- In a handicap parking spot without handicap plaque
- On a sidewalk, crosswalk, front lawn, or railroad track
- In front of any driveway
- Within 15 ft. of a fire hydrant
- Within 20 ft. of a crosswalk
- Within 30 ft. of a yield sign, stop sign, or traffic signal
- Double parking on a street

Speed Limit Signs:

30 mph speed limit signs are installed generally under any one of the following criteria:

- Streets that have documented speeding problems
- Streets that appeal to motorists
- Streets that are the primary entrance into a residential sub-division where the interior streets are all 30 mph

Speed Humps: www.sanantonio.gov/publicworks

Speed Hump eligibility and requirements:

- Speed limit must be 30 mph
- Street length, min. 1,000 ft.
- Neighborhood type: residential
- Number of lanes: only one per direction
- Neighborhood support of 67% is required
- Speed humps may be removed at the request of 67% of the residents on the street

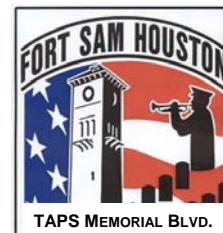

Dear Constituents, Friends and Neighbors:

It has been a privilege to serve District 10 the last two years and I thank you for the opportunity to serve you during the 2009-2011 term. It is my responsibility to be your voice in city government, to work on initiatives that have a positive impact on our city and to improve the quality of life in our district. With your support, and that of the city council, we have been able to accomplish many projects. **The following are just a few of the achievements we have made together:**

- Added **230 additional police officers and 122 fire/EMS positions** across the city
- Added the honorary name addition "**TAPS MEMORIAL BLVD**" to Harry Wurzbach Road; a tribute to those interred at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery
- Opened the **Northeast Multi-Service Senior Center**
- Secured land for a future **permanent** senior center site
- Buried power lines from the CPS Exeter Station under Austin Highway to help improve the aesthetics of the area

Additionally, we made a number of **infrastructure improvements** in District 10 and continue to research the potential to institute quiet zones. Our office is also involved in the planning stages of economic development efforts along Perrin Beitel Road and TAPS Memorial Blvd. We are also working on adding a **Household Hazardous Waste location at the Bitters Rd. Brush Site**. Land has been secured at that location for the mobile unit and we are working toward making it a permanent drop-off site. Our office will continue to **support property tax reductions and will advocate for appraisal reform**. We will keep you updated on these and other projects as we progress.

Our office is here to assist you with many issues, including code compliance, policy, zoning, street repairs, public safety and much more. For your convenience, we have attached the second edition of the **San Antonio Community Guide** with an emphasis on District 10 amenities. This brochure includes a list of the most utilized services and city departments and is intended to improve communication between constituents and the City of San Antonio. Please review the brochure and keep it accessible. Contact information for our staff and me is located on page 8.
