Tropical Depression Ike Situation Report #11

- Ike has weakened to a Tropical Depression with 35 mph sustained winds. A general motion toward the northeast with an additional increase in forward speed is expected during the next couple of days. This motion should bring the center of Ike through the mid-Mississippi Valley today and into the Eastern Great Lake States by Monday morning.
- The reception center has processed 6,564 General population individuals through Port San Antonio and 419 individuals with special needs.
- There are 3,366 individuals in a general population shelter. There are 603 individuals in special needs shelters.
- Currently there are 560 pets being sheltered.
- There are currently 102 personnel from 12 agencies supporting operations at the ARCC.
- According to the Department of Public Safety in Houston, IH45 from IH 10 is possibly underwater; IH45 at Main is underwater; Washington at IH10 is underwater.
- According to the Department of Public Safety in Houston, individuals may now travel IH10 through Jefferson County and Orange County to drive through those counties; however, they will not be allowed to exit in either county.

- According to the Department of Public Safety, the status of Lufkin Area Counties are as follows:

- The Texas Road Condition and Travel Information line (800-452-9292) is staffed by operators until 8 p.m. CDT on Saturday. Recorded information on road conditions is available on a 24-hour basis. Also, information can be accessed through www.txdot.gov.
- Metro Health shelter clinics have nursing staff available around the clock. A team of volunteer physicians is assisting at the shelter clinics three times during each day. Most work in the medical clinics is managing chronic conditions and fulfilling short-term needs (i.e. medications, some equipment, etc.)
- The San Antonio Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (SAVOAD) is seeking volunteers. Members of the community wishing to help with the response to Hurricane Ike are asked to go to the Coliseum Frontier Room. For more information, contact (210) 224-5365.
