Hurricane Ike Situation Report #6

- Hurricane Ike is a Category 2 storm with winds of 100 mph. The storm is moving west/northwest at 10 mph. Hurricane Ike is headed for the northwestern Gulf of Mexico.
- As of yesterday, Port San Antonio is no longer receiving new buses and is now receiving self evacuees and buses with evacuees.
- The reception center has processed 791 general population evacuees, 223 special needs evacuees and 31 buses.
- There are 674 registered general population evacuees and 336 registered special needs evacuees in shelters.
- There are currently 293 personnel from 20 agencies supporting operations at the ARCC.
- The San Antonio Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (SAVOAD) is seeking volunteers. Members of the community wishing to help with the response to Hurricane Ike are asked to go to the Coliseum Frontier Room beginning at noon on September 10. For more information, contact (210) 224-5365.
