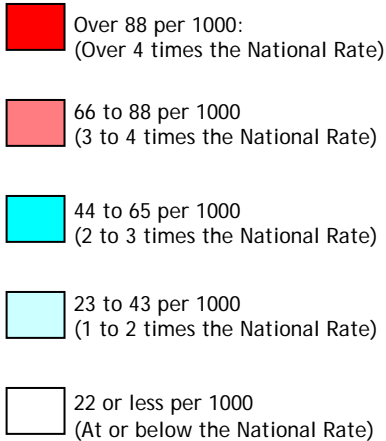

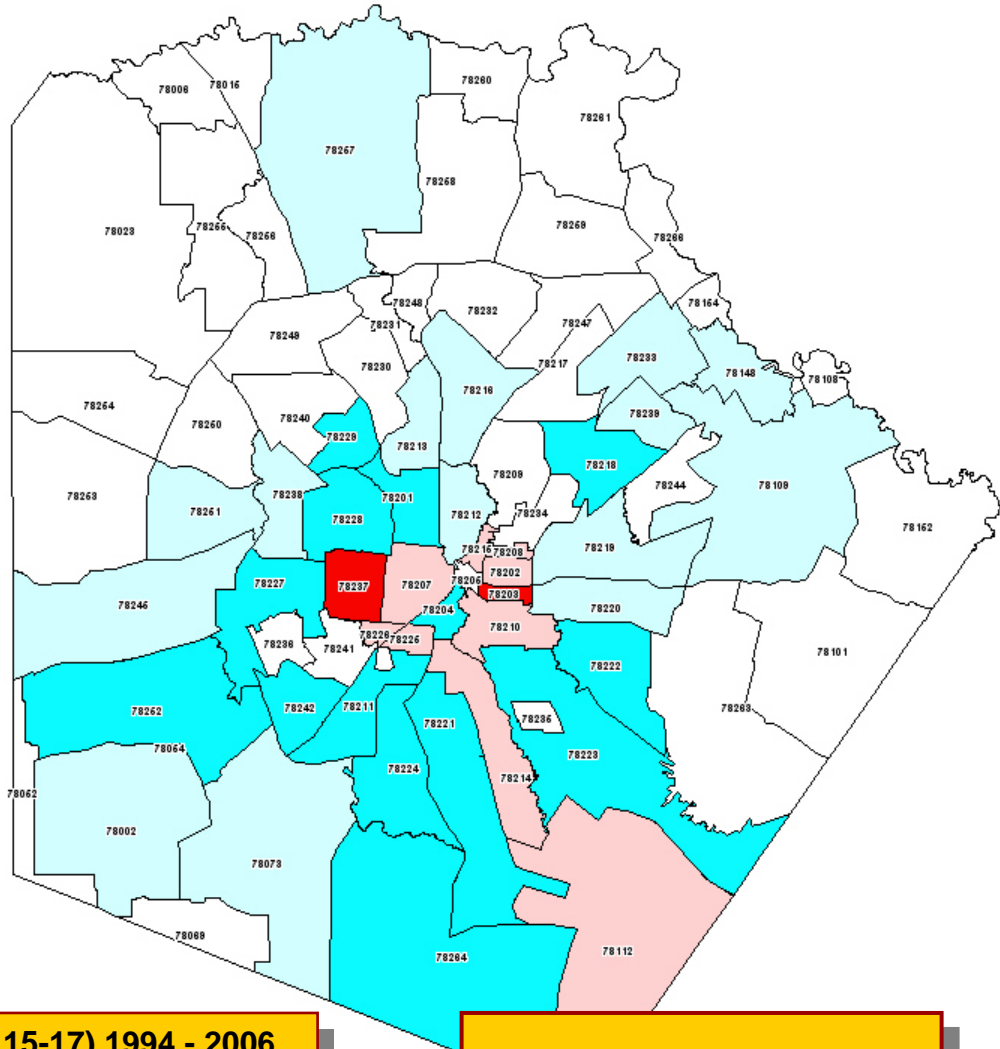

School-Age Birth Rates By Zip Code

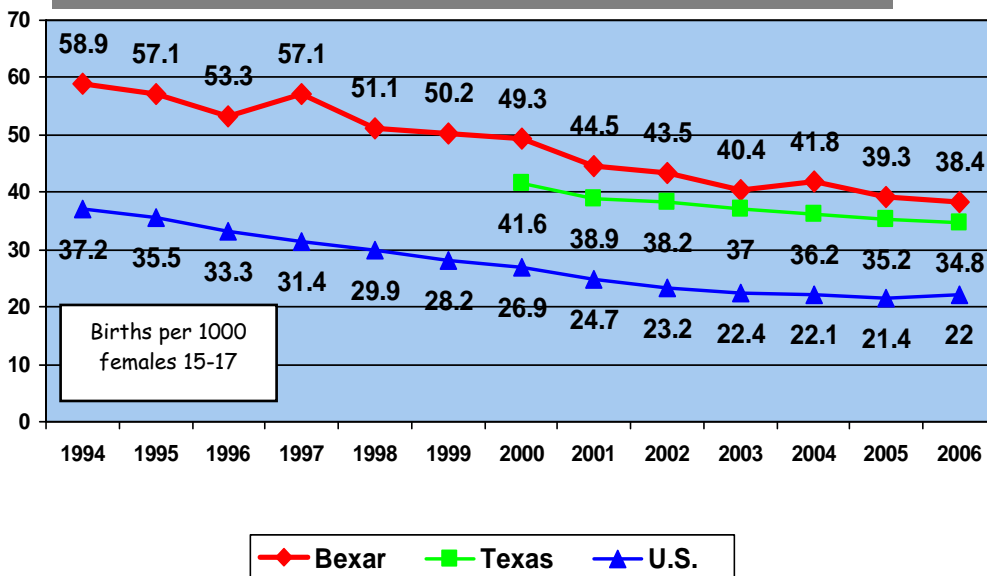
*Births per 1,000 Females

Making Progress Since 1994:

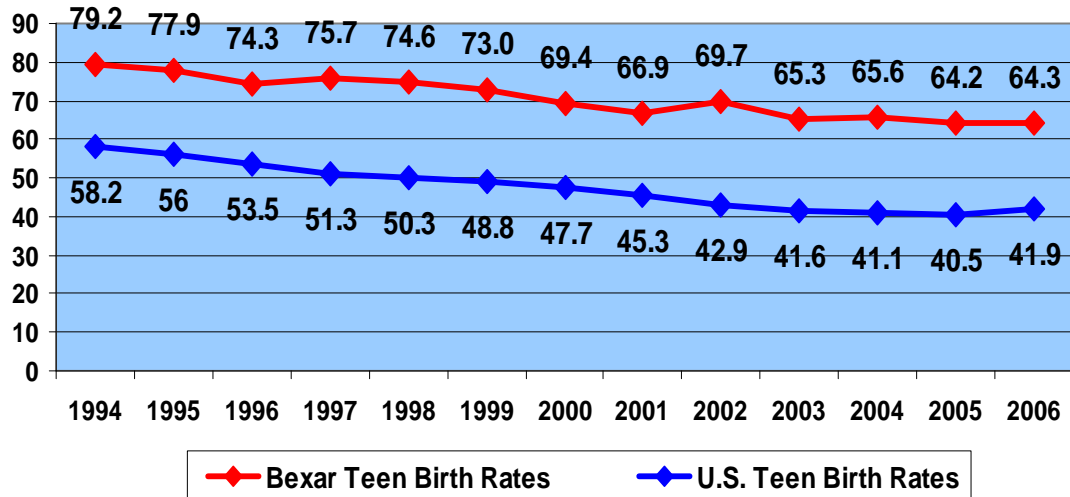
--School-Age Birth Rates (females 15-17) down 35%

Birth Rates (females 15-19) 1994 - 2006



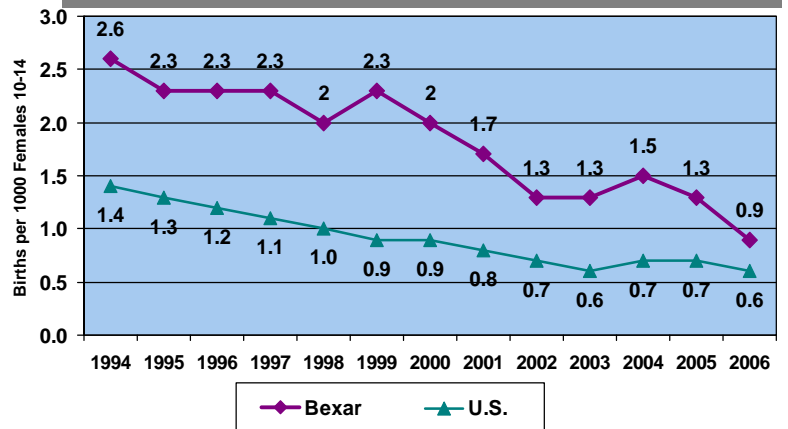
Other 2006 Facts:

- 25% of all Bexar County births to females ages 10-19 were subsequent births.
- 65% of fathers of babies born to females under 18 were themselves 18 years of age and older.
- Cases of Chlamydia remained high at 2,780 for youth ages 10-19.
- 8 more cases of Syphilis among ages 10-19, (31 cases in 2005).
- 2 more cases of HIV among ages 10-19, (10 cases in 2005).
