Thanks to our “Aquifer Champions”

The Green Spaces Alliance (formerly Bexar Land Trust) is acquiring tracts of land over our precious Edwards Aquifer recharge zone. Recently director Julie Koppenheffer and her staff purchased the development rights for a large tract of land in Medina County for \$990,000. As a part of this process the owner keeps their land but signs a conservation easement that restricts development on the land indefinitely. Funding for this effort comes from Proposition 1, which was a sales tax increase approved by voters in 2005. This will allow similar efforts into the future and the alliance has plans to purchase 125,000 acres over five years.
