

Community Advisory Committee

The Community Advisory Committee consists of four members—the Tri-Chairs of the Military Transformation Task Force and a representative of the Board of Directors of the Brooks Development Authority—and was established to represent the San Antonio Community and provide a liaison to the Executive Integration Oversight Board.

Brooks Development Authority

On September 27, 2001, the San Antonio City Council established the Brooks Development Authority (BDA), an independent entity under the Texas Defense Base Development Authorities statute. In addition to its role in economic development, the BDA is responsible for property and infrastructure maintenance, development, land use and environmental planning for Brooks City-Base. A representative from the BDA Board is a member of the Community Advisory Committee.

Military Community

Executive Integration Oversight Board (EIOB)

Established by the AETC/CC and chaired by the AETC Vice Commander. Includes the Commander of the Army Medical Command Center and School, the AETC Air, Space and Information Operations Director, the Commander of Brooke Army Medical Center (San Antonio Military Medical Center [SAMMC] North Campus), the Commander of Wilford Hall (SAMMC South Campus), the Chair of the Medical Education and Training Campus Flag Officer Steering Committee, a senior representative from the TRI-CARE Management Activity, the Director of Brooks City-Base, and a senior representative from the Army Medical Research and Materiel Command. The EIOB is the local military leadership's BRAC issue resolution body.

San Antonio Integration Office (SAIO)

Directed by the Department of Defense to be established under the Director of Plans, Requirements and Programs of the Headquarters Air Education and Training Command. The SAIO is chartered to facilitate communication among all affected stakeholders and the local community, facilitate coordination and support to numerous program/project managers and oversee integration of all military phases of BRAC and non-BRAC actions taking place in San Antonio—including Cross-service medical treatment transformation, consolidation of medical education and training, consolidation of specified medical research, Air Force- and Army-specific unit movements, and the establishment of Joint Base San Antonio.

United States Air Force Air Education and Training Command Commander (AETC/CC)

Designated by the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for Installations, Environment and Logistics (SAF/IE) to assume the lead oversight role in San Antonio for the implementation of medical and other Air Force BRAC actions.

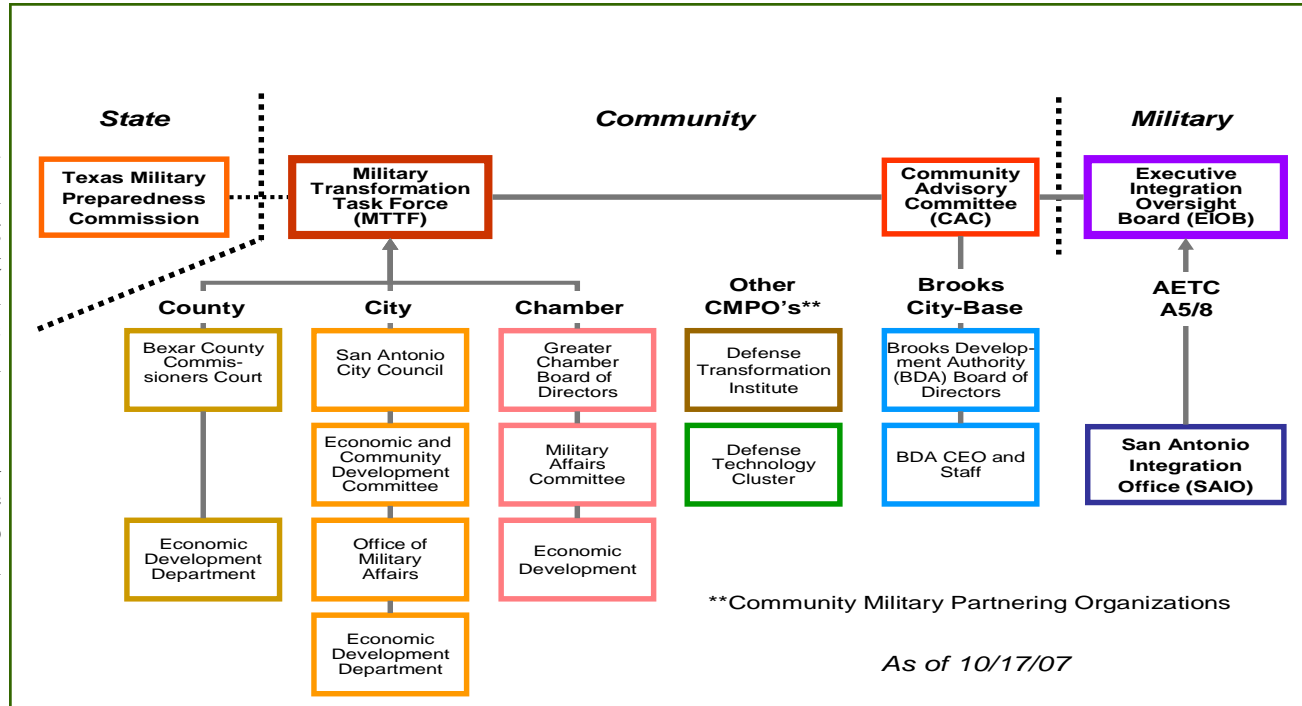

Other CMPO's
Defense Transformation Institute: A not-for-profit organization, DTI seeks to become a nationally recognized authority in developing innovative and successful public-private and public-public partnerships models between the military and the community.

Defense Technology Cluster: The DTC's mission is to accelerate the growth and success of existing Defense Technology (DT) firms, and to support the growth of new DT firms in the San Antonio region.

State of Texas

Texas Military Preparedness Commission (State of Texas) The TMPC's mission is to preserve and expand Texas' military installations and their missions and assist communities that have been impacted by a Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) action.

San Antonio Community

MTTF

A City of San Antonio, Bexar County and Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce initiative to share information, assist the military with BRAC implementation, address any impacts on the community, and leverage BRAC to strengthen San Antonio.

City of San Antonio

- **Economic and Community Development Committee:** A City Council body that develops policies related to economic development, BRAC, military affairs, international affairs, workforce and education, aviation, tourism, and community redevelopment.
- **Office of Military Affairs:** The city department coordinates and facilitates the community's support for BRAC implementation and other military issues affecting San Antonio.

Bexar County

- **Office of Strategic Federal Initiatives:** Within the Economic Development department is the County's designated department for BRAC and Military issues.

Bexar County (cont.)

- **Bexar County Commissioners Court:** Composed of the County Judge and four Commissioners, is the overall managing/governing body of Bexar County. The Court is responsible for budgetary decisions, tax and revenue decisions, and all personnel decisions except for certain positions that are either elected or appointed by the judiciary or other committees.

The Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce

- **Military Affairs Committee:** Fosters relationships among the San Antonio business community and the military, promotes and advocates for key military initiatives with local, state and federal elected officials, hosts visiting delegations, makes recommendations
