Schools

- 8 public schools, 2 charter schools, and 3 private schools
 - 2 school districts: SAISD and East Central ISD
 - 3 elementary schools (excludes Carroll Elementary that closed 2008)
 - 4 academies (pre-K through 8th)
 - 2 high schools, 1 kindergarten through 12th, and 1 6th through 12th

Library

- No library located within Eastern Triangle
- Carver Branch Library and McCreless Branch Library are within 3 miles of Eastern Triangle

City of San Antonio Programs

- San Antonio Education Partnership (SAEP)
 - Located at Sam Houston High School
 - Provide high school advising and supports completing high school and college enrollment

- After School Challenge Program (ASCP)
 - Located at Gates Academy, Hirsh Elementary, King Academy, Stewart Elementary, and W. W. White Elementary
 - Provides on-site after school care for children 5-12 years of age with homework assistance, tutoring, recreational games, and life skills development
- Community Resource and Learning Division (CFRLD)
 - Located at St. Philip's Community Family Resource and Learning Center (Outside Eastern Triangle)
 - GED preparation courses, ESOL, computer literacy, and citizenship courses
 - DCI one-stop service center
 - Provide emergency (basic needs), childcare, and fair housing service assistance.
- Claude Black Community Center
 - Recreational and social services facility (Outside Eastern Triangle)
- Comprehensive Nutrition Program (CNP)
 - Located at Comanche Park #2, Mt. Zion Sheltering Arms Apartments, and Roseville Apartments
 - Provides seniors with nutritionally balanced noon meal, health screening, recreational and social activities, and volunteer opportunities.
- Healthy Start
 - Program to decrease infant deaths
 - Assists pregnant women and their families with prenatal care and assistance until the child is 2 years old
 - 78220 zip code is one of the program's target areas
- Project Worth
 - Designed to help youth make healthy choices and postpone pregnancy
- Steps to a Healthier San Antonio
 - Program encourages good nutrition, increased physical activity, and smoking prevention
 - Target area is SAISD
- WIC
 - Special supplemental nutrition program for women, infants, and children
 - WIC recipients receive food benefits, nutrition education, and counseling, breastfeeding promotion, and health care referrals
 - Service provided to pregnant, postpartum (up to 6 months after birth), breastfeeding women (up to 12 months after birth), and infant and children under age 5.
 - Located at Pecan Valley WIC Clinic and services approximately 2,200 clients per month
