Socialization means providing your dog with positive experiences in situations where he might meet people and/or other animals. He must also learn how to behave acceptably in these situations. Lack of socialization is one of the biggest causes of fear and aggression in adult dogs.

Cool Alamo Puppy is a citizen's advocacy group dedicated to making San Antonio & the surrounding areas a more animal friendly community. Our goal is to organize and make effective the voices of those caring individuals who are our members and supporters in hopes of creating greater awareness in regards to the benefits of proper socialization and care for our pet friends. We do not engage in or support actions that are illegal or violent, or that run counter to the basic principles of compassion and respect for others.

The following locations are a few examples of various existing parks that could use the additional amenity of a leash-free area. The main cost of developing these Dog Parks is involved in the Fencing of the areas, and key components are trash receptacles and a few benches and maintenance, and some bar-b-que pits and trees.


## Base Data for Texas and National average



Pearsall Park






# Orsinger Park Proposed 775 Sq Ft






# Woodlawn Proposed 1000 Sq ft


