



HOLIDAY TIPS FOR TRAVELING

San Antonio, TX- (December 22, 2014) Traveling can become stressful for passengers, especially during the Holidays when airlines add extra flights. If passengers do not arrive with the required documents to travel or are uninformed about TSA guidelines they might not make the flight. Here are a few tips that could make traveling easier.

Early Arrival: Passengers should always arrive two hours prior to their flight. For International flights, passengers should arrive three hours prior to flight, with or without baggage. Boarding begins 45 minutes prior to hour shown on boarding pass.

Know Where to Go: If a passenger rented a car, the car must be turned in with enough time to return to airport. Have a map on hand to make sure you know exactly where to go and what shuttle to take to return to the airport.

Bring All Documents: Passengers should always have a photo ID along with their boarding pass during check in. Passengers traveling international should always have a Passport (including infants).

TSA Security Check Point: Passports/ID's and boarding pass should be on hand. Before passing through TSA make sure that there are no liquids, gels, or hairsprays that exceed 100ml or 3.4oz in carry-on. Jackets, shoes, watches should be taken off, and everything else must be taken out of pockets and placed on the bin that runs through the x-ray machine. Keep in mind that during the Holidays TSA's line may take more time.

Receive email flight notifications – Passengers are now able to check for flight notifications and parking availability online. <http://www.sanantonio.gov/SAT>.

Change of plans? If passenger decides to change flight date or time, they must change it before the departure time of their current flight. Failing to do so, may result in an extra cost for the passenger.
