### **Aquifer Protection and Linear Creekway Programs**

Like many people, I have several questions when it comes to seeking reauthorization of the Edwards Aquifer Protection Program and the Linear Creekway Parks Development Program. This would renew for five years a 1/8 cent sales tax and extend the City's ability to purchase land over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone which is still our primary source for water. Using revenue from an eighth-cent sales tax for these programs would also allow the City's Greenway Trail System to be further developed. These parklands have been described as the pearl necklace around San Antonio.

My questions have included:

1. We've had this "temporary" tax for 15 years, and have acquired 130,000 acres of land and/or development rights and thereby saved approximately 36 billion gallons of water annually. When will we have acquired enough and how will we measure that?
2. What other unmet community needs could be funded with this tax? What is the most important urgent need?

I believe the citizens of San Antonio want more information as to when this effort will be over and how we measure its success. When do we know we've achieved what we set out to accomplish?

### **Provide Input on City Charter**

Through February 25, 2015, you have several opportunities to provide input on possible amendments to the City Charter.

Last fall, Council ordered an election for Saturday, May 9, 2015, to amend the City Charter by requiring an election before any use of the City's right-of-way for streetcar

or light rail.

Subsequently, Council created a Charter Review Commission to study the issues of Council pay, filling of the office of the Mayor in the event of a midterm vacancy and other possible suggestions for amendment. Council will review the recommendations next month.

### **Hardy Oak Improvements**

On January 20, 2015 I joined Transportation & Capital Improvements to celebrate the start of improvements that will connect portions of Hardy Oak.

The Ground Breaking Ceremony was held at the end of Hardy Oak Boulevard south of Stone Oak Parkway. Construction started earlier this month with a completion date expected October 2015.

Plans include constructing a new four-lane divided roadway from Stone Oak to Knights Cross with a shared use path, curbs, sidewalks, driveway approaches and traffic signal and drainage improvements as needed.

The Transportation and Capital Improvements Department (TCI) also looked at the area and has plans to build a sidewalk and a retaining wall nearby to control water flow and prevent flooding to a nearby home. This should also reduce erosion in the alley. TCI will also make minor repairs to the alley and close it off except for use by utility crews when necessary.

## Bulky Waste Collection Center

On January 13, 2015, the City opened the newly-renovated permanent household hazardous waste (HHW) facility and third bulky waste collection center at 7030 Culebra Road.

The new center will provide you with a one-stop drop-off location to dispose of bulky items such as appliances, car tires, old furniture, barbecue grills, lawnmowers as well as HHW items such as antifreeze, batteries, e-waste, paint and pool chemicals for free. These materials are then either recycled by the Solid Waste Management Department (SWMD) or disposed of properly at the landfill.

Official business hours for the Culebra HHW site and bulky waste center will be Tuesday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturday 8 a.m. to noon.
