Significant Decrease in Violent and Property Crimes in San Antonio in latest Uniform Crime Report

Since 2017, San Antonio has witnessed a dramatic and sustained decrease in crime. Preliminary year-to-date Uniform Crime Report (UCR) statistics for the San Antonio Police Department confirm that as of Sept. 30, total Part I UCR crimes, which include violent crime and property crime, are down 17 percent from last year. Additionally, violent crimes including homicide, rape, robbery and aggravated assault are down 10 percent and property crimes including burglary, larceny theft and motor vehicle theft are down 18 percent compared to 2017.



The decrease in crime rates is attributed to

the continued efforts of the Violent Crime Task Force, a proactive, multi-agency unit that was created last year in partnership with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies and SAPD's Covert Units, Street Crimes Unit, SWAT and Fusion Center personnel. The VCTF is an intelligence-driven initiative that strategically focuses on identifying and apprehending known criminals who are responsible for a significant share of the illegal activity that ultimately culminates in violent crimes.

Since Jan. 1, the Violent Crime Task Force made 7,379 arrests (a 97 percent increase compared to last year), executed 2,292 felony warrants (up 39 percent), arrested 582 gang members (up 39 percent), seized 980 firearms (up 59 percent) and seized 343,307 grams of illegal drugs (up 45 percent).

SAPD and City leaders expect to see a continued decrease in crime as a result of the department's ongoing efforts to engage the community.

Housing Update: Short Term Rentals & Infill Development

On October 2nd, the Zoning Commission approved important new code changes which included the amendments to the Infill Development Zoning (IDZ) Code and two other codes in which IDZ has been used to fill the gaps in recent years. These code changes were initiated by A Council Consideration Request (CCR) I filed in April 2017. [You can read that CCR here.](#)



The City of San Antonio's Pothole Patrol broke the record on the number of potholes repaired for the second consecutive fiscal year!

Three years ago, TCI crews transitioned from a response-driven approach to a proactive program where crews strategically identify potholes and make repairs within two business days. To further optimize the repair process and engage the San Antonio community the Pothole Patrol was established in fiscal year 2018.



Compared to other major cities in Texas, San Antonio's proactive approach has produced fantastic results. However, even more potholes can be repaired if residents report potholes they see to 3-1-1. Only 17% of the potholes repaired this year came from residents reporting to 3-1-1.



San Antonio Celebrates the Fourth Annual Distinction in the Arts Awards

In celebration of San Antonio's Tricentennial, the 2018 Distinction in the Arts paid special tribute to all 16 previous honorees for their outstanding achievements in and contributions to arts and culture in San Antonio. This fourth annual event took place Wednesday, Oct. 3, 2018 at the Tobin Center for the Performing Arts.

This event, initiated by District 1 Councilman Roberto C. Treviño, honors those who have worked to advance and maintain the cultural vibrancy of San Antonio in the fields of music, dance, literary arts, visual arts, arts patronage, and arts administration. Distinction in the Arts recognizes artists, and organizations or individuals who have provided enduring and effective cultural leadership, displayed exceptional artistic accomplishments and/or have made a significant contribution and impact to the San Antonio arts community.

"San Antonio is known the world over for its authentic and unique arts and culture. They tell our story, they celebrate who we are, and they help define us," Councilman Treviño said. "The Distinction in the Arts Awards honor those San Antonians who help create and preserve our artistic and cultural treasures."

The evening featured performances by The Jim Cullum Jazz Band, Westside Horns, Juan and Armando Tejeda, Guadalupe Dance Company accompanied by Mariachi Azteca de America, and Teresa Champion accompanied by Chayito Champion. Readings were also presented by Carmen

Tobacco 21 Law Now in Effect

San Antonio became the first city in Texas to increase the minimum legal sales age for tobacco products from 18 to 21, to include electronic smoking devices. The public health measure is intended to reduce the number of young consumers of tobacco products and, in time, reduce overall tobacco addiction. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) tobacco is the leading cause of disease, disability and death in the United States with 95% of adult smokers who started smoking before age 21.



Metro Health teams have communicated with retailer merchant associations via letters, postcards, email, and hosted seven stakeholder meetings. Health inspectors visited more than 1,100 tobacco retailers twice in 2018, to provide Tobacco 21 education materials. A majority of merchants reported that they were aware of the changes. Education for retailers and community will continue thru 2019. Citations to tobacco retailers will only be issued after Jan. 1, 2019, during routine annual inspections and random decoy compliance visits. The penalty for retailers can be up to \$500 if there is no Tobacco 21 signage displayed within the store, not having employee notification forms on file, or for selling to those under 21. Young adults between ages 18 to 20 found in possession will not be cited.


Metro Health is also working with community partners to implement a Tobacco Use Survey to determine use of tobacco products.

Street Improvement Projects Scheduled for Southtown



Transportation & Capital Improvements (TCI) will be working to improve the road surface of a street in Southtown this month. The work to be done includes base repairs, wedge milling and the placement of a new layer of asphalt on the road surface. Street work will be completed on:

- 1. Beauregard – From: Washington - S Alamo St.
- 2. E Guenther St – From: S Flores St – S Alamo St
- 3. E Sheridan – From: S Alamo St – Dead End
- 4. King William – From: S St Mary's – E Guenther St
- 5. Madison – From: S St Mary's – E Guenther St
- 6. Pancoast – From: E Cesar Chavez – Washington
- 7. E Johnson – From: Alamo – Dead End
- 8. Turner St – From: Pancoast – S Alamo St
- 9. Washington – From: Turner – King William
- 10. Washington – From: Turner – Arsenal

TCI contractor LONE STAR PAVING is scheduled to begin the week of **October 1, 2018** and is estimated to be complete by **October 31, 2018**.

While improvements are underway, here is some helpful information about the improvement project to assist you:

- Vehicles should not be parked on the street from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Vehicular traffic will have limited access to the street. Traffic detour barricades and signs will be provided to guide traffic through the construction as needed.

- If your street is completely closed, no traffic will be permitted into the barricaded area.
- In the event of adverse weather, environmental conditions, unforeseen equipment issues, or schedule conflicts, improvements on your street will likely be rescheduled as soon as conditions permit.
