Open Data SA Now Available

Open Data SA is about providing free access to City data in a machine readable format, under an open license that allows the public to reuse and redistribute the data. The City of San Antonio launched this Open Data Portal in beta form in Summer 2018. The City has begun with the publication of some foundational datasets including 311 calls for service, permitting data, and an extensive catalog of GIS datasets.



Over time, this broader use of this portal will be driven by the core operating principle that the City's data is open by default, and it is our mission to make more of the City's data available here. With the help of Open Data, the City aims to be transparent and accountable, improve efficiency and effectiveness of its services, empower citizens and innovate in the way we do business.





- ["The good news is it looks like we have the support we need, and I hope to get more," Treviño said. "Obviously, I would like the entire council to be supportive. The whole idea of the shower is to help the entire city, and the shower will be shared among all the council districts. That's what I'm committed to...Bottom line, we are a compassionate city, and this is the gesture of a compassionate council."](#)
- [Treviño said the soon-to-be-hired pedestrian mobility officer will drastically improve mobility advocacy and public participation when designing street projects big and small in the future. Funding for the position was approved with the city's 2019 budget.](#)
- [Those incidents, Treviño said, helped demonstrate that Walsh was part of a well-run, responsive city government... "That comes expected, but that comes from a lot of hard work," Treviño said. "That comes from someone who has built up respect, command, leadership."](#)
- ["This is an example of the Pearl exercising their rights," he said. "They've done a tremendous job of creating a place people want to visit. It is an amazing place for pedestrian mobility. If they feel this is something they have to do, then I suspect they've done that \[through a\] thoughtful process."](#)

- To his credit, District 1 City Councilman Roberto Treviño has zeroed in on the parking issue, writing in this paper about the need for parking zones.
- Bexar County Sheriff Javier Salazar, City Councilman Roberto Trevino and a child sex trafficking survivor were among the many officials and advocates present at the grand opening.
- “Each of these projects will bring much-needed affordable housing to our center city.” District 1 Councilman Roberto C. Treviño said in a statement. “They are great examples of how the layering of incentives can provide housing that is attractive and affordable to residents.”
- I appreciate District 1 Councilman Roberto Treviño’s insightful op-ed in the Express News about his solutions to tackle the issue of scooter use in downtown and his hope for a city-owned trailer shower for the homeless. His ideas have great value and more City Council members and our mayor need to do more to hold these scooter companies to the same standard they hold the homeless, working poor, and our friends on the street near Travis Park.
