Councilman Trevino Votes in Favor of Hiring 3 Mental Health Clinicians to Assist Homeless Population



This week, City Council authorized the approval of a contract with VHS San Antonio Partners, LLC dba Baptist Health System for the purpose of providing three Mental Health Clinicians to help the homeless population get the necessary assistance that will result in them finding and staying in permanent housing.

The contracted staff will help facilitate an immediate and long-term care plan to address the homeless' serious mental illness and substance use concerns. Upon stabilization, the team will develop a plan for housing, healthcare and economic concerns for long-term stability, with the goal of helping chronic homeless find stable housing/shelter and reduce the number of calls for police service, police contacts and emergency room visits/hospital visits.

Council Approves K9s For Warriors Lease

City Council approved a 10-year lease agreement with K9s For Warriors, the nation's largest provider of service dogs for disabled American veterans.

The agreement was included in the FY2019 budget process and will include the City of San Antonio leasing 3.3 acres of undeveloped land to K9s For Warriors at \$1.00 per year for 10 years with two optional 5-year extensions. Once complete, K9s For Warriors commits to rescue 200 qualifying dogs from ACS each year.

Public Participation Update

City Council unanimously approved a resolution committing the City to principles of public participation.



The resolution is one of several requests made by Councilwoman Sandoval and Mayor Nirenberg, including broadcasting all City Council committee meetings; validating parking or providing bus passes for residents who attend City Council meetings; making councilmembers' voting and attendance records accessible. In addition to these requests, a Citizens Advisory Group will be created to continue advancing public participation in San Antonio.

SCOOTER STRATEGIES



DESIGNATED PARKING ZONES

Scooter parking areas must not impede sidewalks and should be placed away from pedestrian accessibility components — like ADA ramps and bus stops.

We should look at utilizing existing infrastructure, like "No Parking/No Standing" areas, or creating a dedicated public parking space for scooters.



PEDESTRIAN MOBILITY OFFICER

The issues we face with scooters demonstrate the need for new expertise and accountability.

The city and council should immediately task the newly hired PMO with providing data on the safety implications of allowing individuals to ride scooters on sidewalks in addition to implementing speed limits for scooters.



311 SA UPGRADES

By adding a section for scooters to the app, we can create a bridge of communication between residents, the city of San Antonio and scooter companies through data sharing.

Citizen input should help shape policy. Better reporting means better response.



SIDEWALK MASTER PLAN

The lack of bike lanes and incomplete network of sidewalks demonstrate that we have prioritized cars at the expense of people.

We must complete the in-progress sidewalk master plan with an emphasis on cultivating a non-automobile centric focus.


