<p style="text-align: center;"><b>TIC &amp; ACEs Legislation</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>HB 4183 Addressing ACEs- Public Health: (Sent to calendar committee)</b> Relating to addressing adverse childhood experiences and developing a strategic plan to address those experiences.</li> <li>2. <b>HB 1623 Behavior Health-TIC practices- Public Education: (sent to calendar committee)</b> Relating to training for public school personnel to identify and intervene if a student suffers from behavioral health issues.</li> <li>3. <b>HB 3718 TIC Staff Development- Public Education (sent to calendar committee):</b> Relating to a trauma-informed care policy for school districts and open-enrollment charter schools and training regarding the policy for district and school employees</li> <li>4. <b>SB 1893 Including TIC Policy to DIP - Education:</b> Relating to a trauma-informed care policy for school districts and open-enrollment charter schools.</li> </ol>	<div style="text-align: right;">  </div> <p>Three of these four bills (highlighted) surrounding Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Trauma-Informed Care (TIC) are moving through legislation (about 35% movement); a bit slowly but moving. To do our part to get these bills on the legislative calendar with less than a month away from the end of 86th Legislative Session, we must call our legislators. Below is a sample script. The names and phone numbers of the calendars committee are listed below, too. Every time a bill gets a call “for” or “against”, the tick goes up or down. The more they see that people are paying attention and caring about the legislation behind it, the more likely the bill gets on the calendar earlier in the month than later. The earlier it can be placed on the calendar, the better the chances of the bill passing. The later it gets discussed is hardly a good thing as they race towards the end of the session less inclined to discuss bills that are not receiving attention. Time is running out. Call today. Do it. Pick up the phone and support mental health and TIC. This must be a top priority in our communities and schools across our city and state.</p>
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**SCRIPT:**

*“As a Texas voter and taxpayer, I am happy to see the effort made by the House of Representatives to add bills surrounding mental health, such as Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and Trauma-Informed Care. **HB 3718, HB 4183, and HB 1623** are three of the most important pieces of legislation in support of mental health in Texas public schools and community. I am grateful for the effort that went into crafting legislation. My only concern is that these bills will not get placed on the calendar to discuss soon enough. It is so important to train all educators and community members about ACEs. ACEs affect children and adults’ ability to learn and self-regulate. Requiring a strategic plan for supporting children with ACEs as well as implementing trauma-informed care practices is essential to our community’s well-being. These bills will help those affected by ACEs to receive the mental health support they deserve. Please put these bills on the calendar soon. Thank you for your consideration.”*
