Exploring New Sources for Affordable Housing in San Antonio

Presenter:

With the need for affordable housing at a historic high point and growing rapidly, the City of San Antonio is working to identify new fund sources that can be used to support affordable housing. Other alternatives include inclusionary zoning provisions which require multi-family developments in designated areas to either provide affordable units on site or contribute to a fund to support affordable housing development in other locations. Cities can also establish Housing Trust Funds by targeting revenue from a specific source - e.g. "luxury condo transfer" taxes, impact fees etc.
