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Army Supplemental Programmatic Environmental Review (PEA)

- Reduce Active Duty from 490,000 to 420,000
- 30 installations – max reduction 50% of Base Population
- FSH - 12,250 Soldiers and Civilians
 - 4,000 Soldiers at Risk
 - 2,000 Civilians at Risk
- Positive
 - Strong METC Mission
 - SAAMC
 - No BCT's (Combat Forces)
- Negative
 - Major Headquarters Vulnerable
 - Proportionate Drawdown of Medics

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Army Supplemental Programmatic Environmental Review (PEA)

- Impact to Community
 - BRAC without a BRAC
 - Arbitrary Decision
- Way Ahead
