LiPS: Phonemic Sequencing for Kindergarten

Phonemic awareness, the ability to notice, discriminate, sequence and manipulate sounds in words without letters, requires extreme attention to the sounds (phonemes) in the English language. In this workshop, the participant will gain a critical understanding of the research supporting phonemic awareness skill building as a precursor to phonics instruction. Research indicates children who develop and rehearse phonemic awareness skills eventually demonstrate significantly higher reading achievement than children who have not developed their phonemic awareness skill set.

This workshop gives the Kindergarten educator the specific tools to evaluate each student's phonemic awareness needs and explicitly deliver daily, brief group instruction to enhance this skill set and complement existing language arts and early reading curriculum.

Based on the Lindamood Phoneme Sequencing Program, this instruction includes the research of phonemic awareness as well as the hands-on rehearsal of discrimination and sequencing of English phonemes required for future phonics acquisition.
