Staff Notes: This kitten eats well on own and able to go to the bathroom. She is painful when she attempts to defecate and we suspect she may have "manx syndrome." She is missing her tail and likely was born this way. Therefore, the nerve endings along her rear may not have developed fully and could be the cause as to why it's hard for her to finish defecating. The kitten is expected to do well, would just need to be on a high fiber diet (such as royal canine gi intestinal) to ensure stool moves along nicely and have someone familiar with manx syndrome to help stimulate her rear nerve endings to encourage appropriate defecation. Needs an experienced foster or rescue to stimulate area until out of kitten hood. Expect full recovery if proper care is given now. Friendly cut kitten.
