## **Applications being Accepted for At-Large Positions on the Building Standards Board**

**SAN ANTONIO (March 26, 2019)** – The City of San Antonio is seeking applicants for 4 At-Large Positions on the Buildings Standards Board (BSB) for 2-year terms of office to expire May 31, 2021. The BSB consists of two, 7-member panels that hear and rule on violations of the San Antonio Property Maintenance Code (SAPMC) and summary abatement appeals.

The Building Standards Board (BSB) is a citizen-based board and includes 14 members appointed by the City Council. Property owners are allowed to appeal an SAPMC Notice of Violation to the BSB based on issues of interpretation, intent, and application of code requirements. The BSB may issue civil penalties for failure to comply with the SAPMC. The panels also rule on cases related to the repair or demolition of unsafe structures. Meetings are generally held at the Cliff Morton Development and Business Services Center, located at 1901 S. Alamo St.
